1. Executive Summary

Consultation on the Southern Open Space component of the Bruce Comben Reserve Master Plan Implementation project was held throughout May 2022 with stakeholders able to provide feedback through both Council's online engagement platform and two face to face opportunities, one in the Southern Open Space section of Bruce Comben Reserve and the second at Homestead Run Seabrook.

Drawing on the feedback received during the master plan process, the draft open space concept plan promotes a strong focus on the natural environment in the southern section of the reserve. It includes increased tree planting to provide shade whilst also reducing the urban heat island effect in this area and ensures the protection of the emu foot native vegetation along the Skeleton Creek corridor. A connecting path network links into the Skeleton Creek Trail down to the Hobsons Bay Coastal Trail and maintains the important pedestrian link to Seabrook at the recently updated Lan Avenue Bridge.

Pathways will also connect to an upgraded play space, picnic area and new toilets.

We are proposing to upgrade and extend the Henry Drive Carpark to accommodate the use in the southern end of the reserve. This extended carpark can also be used as an overflow carpark from the sporting fields and the aquatic centre, encouraging people to park off street rather than in the nearby residential streets.

The two existing southern tennis courts will be retained and refurbished, and a multiuse activity court servicing basketball, netball and Sepak Takraw is proposed.

The footprint of a new junior sportsfield at the back of the existing pavilion is also included as part of the design however the construction of this oval will be with the future works onsite relating to the Aquatic Facility. Once developed, it is proposed that when this sportsfield is not in use, it will serve as a dog off leash area, freeing important and much-loved open space at the bottom section of the reserve.

There are a couple of themes coming through the consultation that should be addressed. These include:

- o provision of tennis courts and wind barriers around the courts,
- o the need to increase tree cover particularly native trees in the reserve,
- o and the provision of a dedicated dog off leash area separate from the proposed junior sports field.

There is also a lot of interest in the upcoming consultation on the proposed aquatic facility in the northern section of the reserve and the subsequent removal of the Laverton Swim and Fitness Centre once a new aquatic centre has been opened.
































