Our open spaces are equitably distributed across the municipality within a safe 10-minute walk of 95 per cent of residents. The spaces are well-connected, safe and co-located with community infrastructure. Our open spaces also cater for a diverse range of community uses and groups.

The network of open spaces supports biodiversity and habitat links, while being resource-efficient, sustainable and resilient to climate change.
